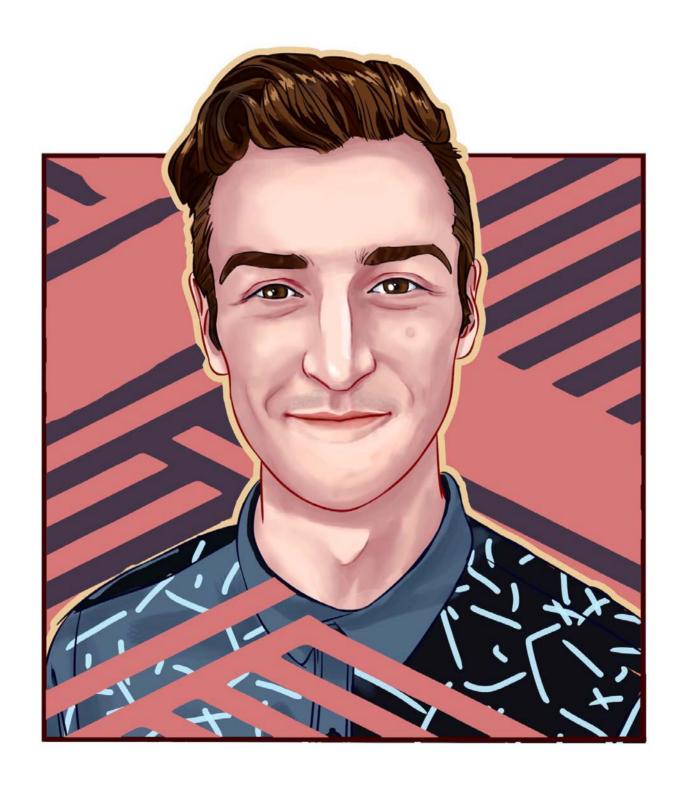
# Jeremy's English Tips

# **Transcript**

But in reality, those who get close to that top will tell you, you never really get there.

This might sound discouraging to some people, but I believe it is a wonderful gift. This means that we get to enjoy the language learning journey for our entire lives. I am still learning words in English. I am still learning about the English language and I have had a young man's lifetime speaking, reading and interacting with this language. I have taught this language for almost a decade, and still, there are words that I have never encountered. So, please don't feel discouraged. I hope that you can find enjoyment in the endless journey.
